# **Perennial Ryegrass**

This cool season grass is an adaptable residential sod designed for all-around living and use. This cool season grass is widely used and highly adaptable. The quick germination and rapid growth of Perennial Ryegrass makes it difficult for weed growth and prevents soil erosion when

**used on steep inclines.** Perennial Ryegrass is a low maintenance grass that resists disease and insects, and has a pleasant green color once established.

# **CARING FOR YOUR PERENNIAL RYEGRASS LAWN**



## SPRING

#### Maintenance

In early spring, rake up any debris. Use Scotts<sup>®</sup> Turf Builder<sup>®</sup> Halts<sup>®</sup> Crabgrass Preventer with Lawn Food if needed. Four weeks later, follow with Scotts<sup>®</sup> Turf Builder<sup>®</sup> Weed & Feed for a lush, green lawn. Fill in bare spots with Harmony<sup>®</sup> sod, available by the piece at your home improvement center.

#### Watering

Water deeply and infrequently about 1" a week to encourage deeper roots. Early morning watering prevents diseases.

#### Mowing

Mow at 2-2½". A long grass blade isn't required if temperature is above 60 degrees and grass is deep green.



### SUMMER

Maintenance In early summer, feed with Scotts® Turf Builder® SummerGuard® Lawn Food to strengthen the lawn, helping it withstand heat and drought conditions. It slowreleases nutrients, making it the go-to

#### Watering

fertilizer for all grass types.

Water deeply and infrequently, about 2" a week to encourage deeper roots, between midnight and 5 am. Water if you notice a dark, bluish-gray color, foot printing, wilted, folded or curled leaves.

Mowing Mow at 2½-3". Dormant in hot weather.



## **FALL/WINTER**

#### Maintenance

In cooler weather, use a slow-release fertilizer like Scotts® Turf Builder® WinterGuard® Fall Lawn Food, to strengthen the lawn's roots. It feeds the lawn consistently and is better for the environment.

Watering Decrease water as the temperatures cool and the rainy season starts.

> Mowing Mow at 2-2½".
